I write to share news about a program that our Superintendent and School Board support, and that we as a site strongly endorse. La Cañada High School has applied for and been accepted to work with Challenge Success. This program, headquartered at Stanford University, aligns with much of our own vision on providing resources and support for all students at LCHS. Challenge Success describes their mission succinctly:



At Challenge Success, we believe that our society has become too focused on grades, test scores, and performance, leaving little time for

kids to develop the necessary skills to become resilient, ethical, and motivated learners. We provide families and schools with the practical, research-based tools they need to create a more balanced and academically fulfilling life for kids. After all, success is measured over the course of a lifetime, not at the end of a semester.

We will initiate this work by sending a representative team, a team comprised of our two site Principals, teacher leaders, student representatives, and parent volunteers. A team from each school will travel to Stanford to work in partnership with Challenge Success and they study how we might move forward in this work at both the 7/8 grade site, as well as the 9-12 level.
